## The Finger Lakes Story

Sparkling lakes, breathtaking waterfalls, and rolling pastoral land dominate the landscape of the Finger Lakes Region. Over thousands of years, gigantic glaciers and coursing streams carved this landscape shared by generations of people. Off the southwest shore of Cayuga Lake, Allan H. Treman State Marine Park is one of 29 facilities of the Finger Lakes State Park Region where you can enjoy these treasured landscapes and discover the lives of people of the past.

This park is one of the largest inland marinas in New York State. In addition to providing excellent boating facilities, this park offers wonderful opportunities for picnicking, bird watching, or just taking a stroll along the Cayuga Lake shoreline.

## The Nature of Allan H. Treman

During the past million years, giant sheets of ice, or glaciers, covered New York State several times, dramatically transforming the land in its path. In this region, the most recent glacier moved through shallow river valleys leaving in their place deep troughs with steep sides. When the glacier receded north about 10,000 years ago, water filled these new troughs, creating the 11 Finger Lakes including Cayuga Lake. At 38.1 miles in length (61 km) and 435 feet in depth (132 m) at its deepest spot, Cayuga Lake is one of the largest Finger Lakes.

Following the last Ice Age, streams eroded gorges in the steep surrounding hillsides and deposited sediments in the southern end of the lake creating a great marsh. Over the years, the marsh was filled to create land for the City of Ithaca.

## People and Allan H. Treman

The Cayuga Indians, one of the Six Nations of the Haudenosaunee (Iroquois) in New York, lived in the area for many years. They fished, hunted and farmed on the marsh's edges. The Indians were largely driven out by the Continental Army in 1779 during the Revolutionary War.

Starting in the 1790's, the marsh was gradually filled in to make solid land to support a growing urban community. This park has seen many uses over time, as it was once a railroad terminal, a city peach orchard,

## Facilities

**MARINA:** 399 wet slips, 30 dry slips and 24 Canoe/Kayak slots available for seasonal rental. All boats must be removed from the marina by the fourth Monday of October.

Comfort Station: Hot showers and flush toilets

Marine Pumpout Stations: Free of Charge.

**DAY USE:** Permitted activities are posted in the park office.

Boat Launch: A launch fee is in effect from April through November, and is payable at the automated pay station.

Transient Slips: Short-term mooring slips are available.

Picnic Areas: Tables and grills

While the park is open year-round, some facilities and activities are only available on a seasonal basis. Please check with the park office before arriving at the park.



Accessible parking spaces and restrooms are available. Contact the park office for specific information.

## MARINA SLIP RENTALS

**Seasonal Boat Slips:** Seasonal slips are assigned annually by lottery. Returnees are guaranteed a slip for 5 years. Applications hand delivered or postmarked January 1<sup>st</sup> through 15<sup>th</sup> qualify for the lottery, returnees included. Applications postmarked prior to January 1<sup>st</sup> will not be considered. Applications not chosen in the lottery or received after January 15<sup>th</sup> will be assigned slips subject to availability. For applications and more details contact the park office.

a county airport, a county fair site, a city marina and a repository for dredge-spoil materials.

Since the mid-1960's, this land has become part of a recreation center at the southwest corner of Cayuga Lake. The city of Ithaca developed facilities for swimming, ice skating, baseball, picnicking, jogging and exercise in Cass Park. In 1972, the state marine park was named in honor of Allan H. Treman, a distinguished former chairman of both the Finger Lakes State Park Commission and the State Council of Parks. After he died, a grove of trees was planted on the mound overlooking the lake as a memorial to Mr. Treman's contribution to state parks and the community of Ithaca.

In 2015, NYS Parks began installing solar energy panels and lighting fixtures throughout the park. Solar arrays can be found in the launch parking lot, and between the dog park and Route 89. It is expected that the solar energy produced by these panels will meet or exceed the electrical demands of Allan H. Treman State Marine Park, placing the park on a sustainable path forward.

## Marina Rules & Regulations

- Berths are not to be subleased.
- The Commission reserves the right to ASSIGN and RE-ASSIGN slips as it deems appropriate to efficient and equitable use of the slips available.
- Boat trailers for seasonal renters are not to be stored in the park.
- Overnight occupancy in camping units is prohibited.
- Off-season storage of boats available through a concessionaire.
- All boats in an electrical slip will pay the electrical fee.
- Berthing area shall be kept neat and clean, i.e., no paint removing, painting, hanging out clothes.
- Use and occupancy of all boats shall be in compliance with applicable regulations of Federal and State agencies with respect to licensing, equipment, etc.
- Sections 377 (i) 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 394.3 of the Official Rules and Regulations affect marinas and fishing. Please consult a park employee if there is any question.
- Any condition aboard or around a boat declared a fire hazard, in the Judgment of the Commission or its representative in charge of the marina shall be removed immediately by the owner to the satisfaction of the Commission or its representative in charge of the marina.
- Runways and boardwalks around berths must be kept clear

## Special Passes

The **Access Pass** is available to New Yorkers with qualifying disabilities. The **Golden Park Program** allows New York State residents 62 years of age or older unlimited weekday and non-holiday access to all state parks by showing a NYS driver's license or non-driver identification. The **Empire Passport** provides unlimited vehicle entry to most state parks and recreation areas. Passes can be purchased in person at most state parks or recreation areas, or by mail from State Parks, Albany, NY 12238.

at all times. Supplies and materials, dinghies, refrigerators, carpeting, television antennas, bikes, tires, fire hose, etc., will not be attached to piers, catwalks and piles.

12. No open fires will be allowed on boats, decks, or piers in the marina basin. This will be STRICTLY ENFORCED.

13. Pets at all times shall be caged or restrained by a leash not more than six feet in length (1.8 m). Pets are not allowed in bathrooms or shower stalls.

## TO OUR OVERNIGHT GUESTS

**Quiet Hours:** Quiet hours in the marina are from 10:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. and are STRICTLY enforced. Your cooperation is appreciated by park staff and your fellow boaters.

**Generator Hours:** Generators may be operated from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. and from 5:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. and must be attended.

**Check In/Check Out:** Check-in time is 3:00 p.m. Boaters must occupy the slip by 9:00 p.m. on the scheduled day of arrival or call the park office. Check-out time is 11:00 a.m.

## TO ALL OUR GUESTS

**Trailers:** Trailer parking by permit only. Obtain permit at Park Office. Seasonal trailer storage is available at Sampson and Seneca Lake State Parks.

**Blading, Boarding and Bicycling Safety:** Safety helmets must be worn by children 14 years of age and younger.


**Pets:** Family pets must be leashed and attended at all times outside the designated, fenced off-leash area.

**Off-Leash Dog Park:** A fenced off-leash area is now available at the park for dogs. All rules and regulations must be followed to use the area.

Proof of rabies vaccination must be by **Veterinarian's certificate**-the collar tag will not be accepted as proof.

**Respecting Wildlife:** Please do not feed or harass any wildlife while visiting the park. If you see any wildlife that appears ill, leave it where it is and contact park personnel immediately. If you come in physical contact with an animal, report it to a park employee right away.
