

New York Statewide Campsite and Cabin Reservation Program

Reservations are processed for a fee with all major credit cards accepted up to 9 months in advance. Call 1-800-456-CAMP or make online reservations on the internet at www.reserveamerica.com. All campsites, cabins and cottages in the Thousand Islands Region are site specific except campsites at Mary Island and Cedar Island State Parks. Site specific reservations allow you to reserve a specific numbered site, if available. Some parks may have designated prime campsites with additional surcharge and pet free areas.



Your key to all-season enjoyment at New York state parks is the Empire Pass. The Pass provides unlimited day use vehicle entry to most facilities operated by the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation and the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation. Come enjoy the forests, the seashore, lakefronts and trails... every day if you like, and bring as many friends as your car holds!



The ACCESS PASS is available to New York residents with qualifying disabilities. The Pass provides free entry and use of state parks and recreation areas and their facilities, except those services and facilities that are operated by a concessionaire. Application forms are available from State Parks, Albany, NY 12238.



SENIOR CITIZENS who are New York State residents and 62 years of age or older can have unlimited weekday and non-holiday access to all state parks and discounts on certain fees by showing their New York State driver's license or New York State non-driver identification.

Pets & Rabies

1. There is a strict limit of two (2) pets per campsite and cabin, where allowed.
2. All pets, where allowed, must be supervised and kept under constant control, either caged or on a leash not exceeding six feet in length.

With the outbreak of rabies in New York State, it is imperative that the following rules be followed:

3. All pets must have a veterinarian's certificate of inoculation as proof of currently effective rabies inoculation. There can be no exceptions to this rule.
4. Feeding wild animals prohibited.

Macomb Reservation State Park

In 1934, Mr. Southwick, the project manager, was detailed to survey the Schuyler Falls area as a protective military reservation. Here was a wild, almost inaccessible area of sub-marginal land with mostly inactive farms, some of them having been unworked for years. During the five years from 1934 to 1939, 76 separate tracts of land were acquired and soon work started under a Work Progress Administration project. Upwards of 300 men were employed trimming underbrush, constructing and improving some 14 miles of road, surrounding the area with barb wire fencing, and performing other necessary preliminary work.

The transfer of over 6,098 acres near Schuyler Falls by the U.S. Department of Agriculture to the War Department was in keeping with the Presidential Order signed June 15, 1939. The ceremonies held in the picnic area five miles west of Schuyler Falls were impressively beautiful, although only a few dozen people were present. Here, July 1, 1939, on the shore of the newly created Salmon River Pond, now known as Davis Pond, the formal transfer was made.

The largest peacetime war games were held in 1939. Over 50,000 troops from the First Army converged on Clinton County, for the maneuvers. The 26th infantry had no facilities for outdoor training. The infantry and cavalry units were stationed at various points in the area. The picnic grounds accommodated some 500 officers who acted as umpires during the war games. On April 28, 1947 the "United States of America" signed a deed over to "The People of the State of New York."

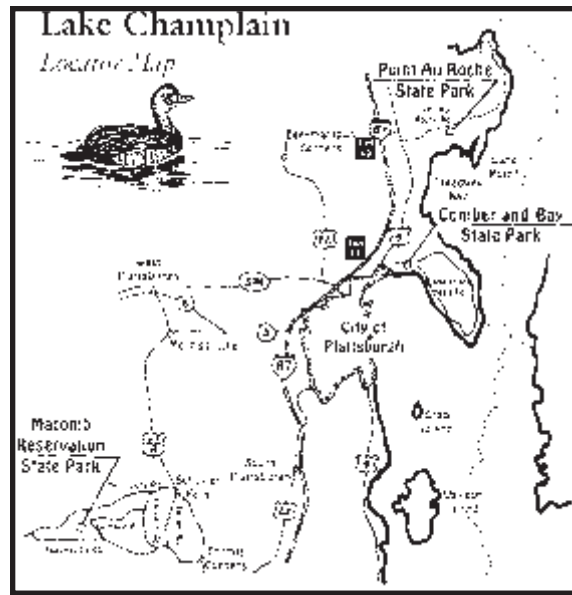
In 1957, the NYS Dept. of Conservation started a campsite at Macomb Reservation.

In 1968, Macomb Reservation, approximately 700 acres, was transferred to NYS Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation.

Park Rules

1. Quiet hours between 10 pm and 7 am are strictly enforced. Also, any use of generators will be limited to 9-11 AM and 5-9 PM.
2. All pets must be secured by a 6 foot or shorter leash and under complete control at all times.
3. Pets are prohibited in the beach area.
4. All plants, trees and animals are protected by law.

RECYCLING IS MANDATORY

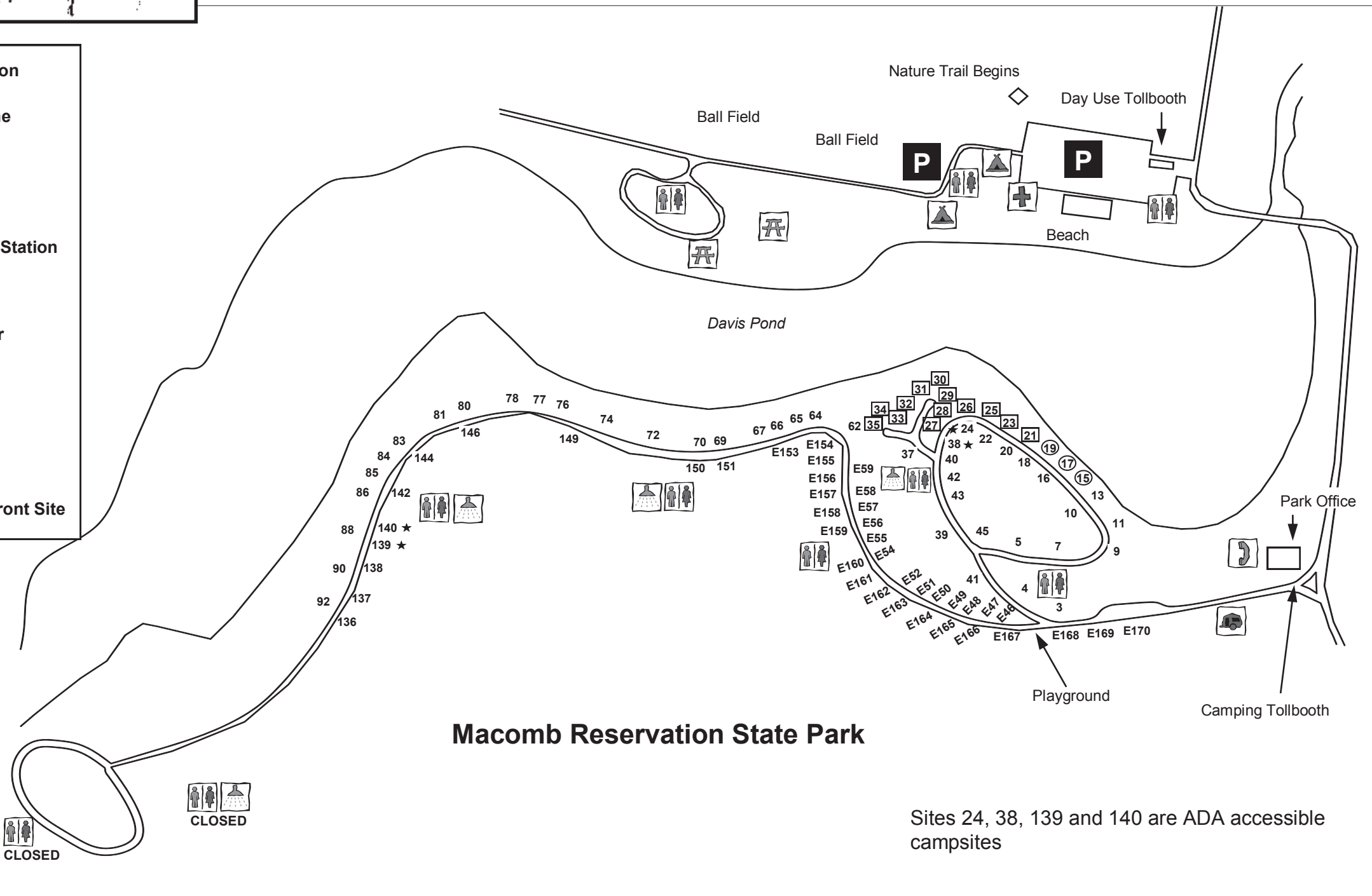


1. Clean and rinse recyclable bottles, jugs, jars and cans in your dishwasher after the dishes have been washed. Mud sinks are also available for your use. Please do not wash out recyclables under water spigots or in restrooms.
2. Recyclable items will be checked and rejected if they are dirty or not processed properly.
3. It is the campers' responsibility to deposit garbage and clean recyclables at the centralized collection center near the park shop during specified hours.
4. A "carry in—carry out" policy is enforced for all picnicking and day use garbage.

Macomb Reservation Today

Macomb Reservation State Park is one of three parks in the Lake Champlain Complex. This park is located outside the northeast corner of the Adirondack Park in Schuyler Falls, NY. Large parcels of state land surround the facility which creates a wilderness effect for the park. Davis Pond, which is man-made, is located in the park. A large picnic area offers a place to spread out and enjoy the pond and the wooded area surrounding it. The main activities in the park are fishing in the pond and in the Salmon River, swimming, sunning, and picnicking. Lake Champlain and the Adirondacks are nearby for those looking for adventurous day trips.
